Purpose	To raise awareness of the facts about HIV, the experiences of people living with HIV and to challenge stigma through sharing your personal experience in a range of settings.
Work Area	Public facing & Raising HIV Awareness
Key Activities	As an HIV Awareness Training Volunteer you'll play a key role in challenging HIV stigma and sharing factual information about HIV. You'll have access to public speaking skills training and will also gain experience of telling people about your experiences to a wide range of audiences.

Time Commitment	This role is very flexible and can work around your commitments.
Location	This activity is all about getting information about HIV out into the community. Volunteering could take place anywhere in Greater Manchester.
