




ACT UP AND PAINT THE TOWN RED FOR PEOPLE LIVING WITH HIV

PAINT THE TOWN RED is George House Trust's month long campaign in November to resist, show solidarity and remember people living with HIV in the runup to World AIDS Day.

We're asking you to Act Up and show support by 'painting the town red'. Whether it be wearing a red ribbon in support of people living with HIV or organising a fundraiser that supports our life-changing work.

For 40 years, George House Trust have been inspiring people living with HIV to live healthy confident lives through support, advice and advocacy services.

Today, we offer over 30 services to people living with HIV from all backgrounds across Greater Manchester and Liverpool, with our suporting ranging from peer-support after a first diagnosis to formula milk for new parents and employment upskilling and support.

SOME IDEAS FOR FUNDRAISING





One of the easiest things you can do is sell **Red Ribbons** for a donation. You can order these and a collection bucket from the team.



Why not hold a **coffee morning** or **bake sale**, they are great ways to bring people together and raise money.



A **raffle** or **guess the square** competition is good fun and any profit can be donated.



Take on a **physical challenge**, either as an individual or a team, whether its a step challenge, running 10k, or doing 40 press ups.



Take on a challenge and ask for **sponsorship**, you could do a sponsored silence or no email day. Have fun with it!



Run your own **quiz event**, challenge your friends or team mates to join you and try to be the champion.

2. CREATE AN ONLINE GIVING PAGE


The quickest and easiest way to collect donations is to create an online giving page we'd suggest using Just Giving or Enthuse. Don't forget to add a fundraising target and share videos and updates to keep supporters engaged.

3. TELL EVERYONE ABOUT IT

Share your fundraiser with friends, family and colleagues, social media is a great way to spread the word and ask for donations. Remember to tag us!



SOME THINGS TO CONSIDER IF YOU'RE GOING TO TAKE PART



- If you are holding a large or public event, make sure you complete a **health and safety risk assessment** and that you have sufficient first aid cover for the size of your event. Please check with your local authority for more information.
- You will need a licence from your local council to do a street collection, so please contact the fundraising team at George House Trust for further information.
- If you plan to sell **alcohol or have live entertainment** at your event, ensure you have the correct licences.
- If you're **selling food**, be sure to check out the latest food hygiene regulations at **food.gov.uk**
- Publicity will be key to the success of your event, so please **contact us to request our logo** with charity number (a requirement by law).
- While raffles and lotteries are a great way to boost your fundraising, please make sure you check out the latest regulations with the Gambling Commission. Visit gamblingcommission.gov.uk
- Your event will be in support of George House Trust, which means it is your responsibility to make it safe and legal. George House Trust cannot accept any liability.

HOW TO PAY US THE MONEY YOU HAVE RAISED...

1. JUST GIVING

If you've been fundraising using JustGiving, your work here is done! Any donations on your page (even ones made after your event) will be sent directly to us. No need to chase anyone. You can add your offline donations to your JustGiving page, meaning that you can see your final total in one place. Visit JustGiving.com to find out how.

2. ENTHUSE

You can donate via enthuse on our website. Simply click the button that says 'donate'.

3. BACS

It only takes a couple of minutes! Please get in touch with our team if you want to do a BACs payment for our bank details.
